Jewish Family Service has been very active since our last Family Ties. Our Bikur Chaverim (visiting friends) program continues our commitment to keeping older members of our community engaged, Catch-a-Cab continues to provide them with transportation to the grocery and physicians, and our Lifeline program continues to ensure that they remain able to contact help—whether they are aware of the need or not. You will read about these programs, as well as how Teen Life Counts makes a difference in the lives of teens, how Bookasaurus can make a difference in the lives of children, and how the New Orleans Parents Club is making a difference in the lives of families. And, of course, our counseling and case management services continue to make a difference in the lives of New Orleanians of all ages.

In October, we're expanding our reach to Cuba! JFS is leading a mission to visit with the Cuban Jewish community and provide medical supplies. The mission includes five days in Havana and two in Cienfuegos as well as Shabbat dinner with members of the Cuban Jewish community. We're leading a second mission to Cuba in April 2012. COUNSELING, SERVICES AND PROGRAMS

- **Counseling** – Guidance and psychotherapy for individuals of all ages, couples, and families
- **Case Management** – Planning assistance for long-term care

BIKUR CHAVERIM: A Prescription For Health

When a friend isn't himself, the Bikur Chaverim visitor notices.

Pete has been visiting Mr. Meyers for over two years, and the two men have become friends over the course of that time. During a recent visit, Pete noticed that Mr. Meyers was not acting like himself. Instead of his usual calm and gentle demeanor, Mr. Meyers began speaking loudly, seemingly to imaginary people, and Pete was concerned that Mr. Meyers was hallucinating.

Pete pulled aside Mr. Meyers' aide and questioned her about his behavior. The aide confirmed that this behavior was unusual and had just begun that morning. Pete suggested that Mr. Meyer go to a doctor as soon as possible.

Mr. Meyer was admitted to the hospital and diagnosed with a urinary tract infection and was treated promptly. His odd behavior went away, and he was truly grateful to Pete for making sure he got the help he needed.

Thanks to Pete's caring, perceptiveness and action, Mr. Meyer is fine and receiving proper care. It is important to pay attention to unusual behavior and to note that hallucinations could be caused by a urinary tract infection, high blood pressure, or a thyroid condition, all treatable conditions.

- Lifeline served **887** older adults or people with disabilities
- Bookasaurus collected and distributed over **5,300** books to children in need
- **35** families participated in the New Orleans Parents Club
- Homemakers provided services to **77** individuals on a weekly or bi-weekly basis
- **578** clients were seen for therapy, with approximately **5,472** hours of counseling services provided
- **173** case management clients were seen for a total of **741** hours.

TEEN LIFE COUNTS: Caring for Kids Who Think No One Cares

Each year, Teen Life Counts (TLC) volunteers teach high school and middle school students about Warning Signs of Suicide. The goal of the program is to help teens identify friends who exhibit or experience these symptoms and help them get to a trusted adult who can get them the professional help they may need.

Recently, Sara, a TLC volunteer, visited a ROTC class in a public school in Jefferson Parish. When the kids walked in, they seemed to be thinking, "Who is this lady?" and Sara had the feeling that this was going to be a challenge. The students were all eating and talking as the teacher was trying to take roll. The teacher looked at Sara and wished her luck as this

was "the hardest class to control and they hate coming to this class." He then told her that he thought, "most of these kids are a bunch of losers anyway."

Sara was determined to make sure these kids knew that she had an important message for them, she CARED, and there are other adults out there that do as well. The first

day was extremely tough, and there was a young man in the back named Nick that seemed to be very angry and yelled out, "Why do you care? You don't know what we have to deal

with!" But, he also participated in the class and toward the end he shared that his father committed suicide when he was 8.

After class, Sara spoke to the school counselor and she assured Sara that Nick was in counseling. The next day he seemed even more angry but continued to participate and answer questions. After class, he approached Sara and said, "Thank you so much. You really helped me deal with my dad's death and I am so sorry for acting out. Going through the TLC program gave me an opportunity to cry and talk about it, which I'm not allowed to do outside of therapy too often."

Teen Life Counts does make a difference.

Jewish Family Service and the Uptown JCC Summer Camp teamed up to launch Bookasaurus, a community project of JFS through which kids host a birthday party and their friends bring gently used children's books to donate to children in need in the New Orleans community.

To launch Bookasaurus, the JCC campers participated in a week long competition to see which camp group could bring in the most gently used children's books. The competition was fierce but, in the end, Zion, the oldest group of campers, took the lead with over 900 books collected!

LIFELINE



Lifeline has reached a major milestone of **700 subscribers**, the largest number in the history of our program! Our industry-leading standard Lifeline Service provides fast access to highly trained, caring Response Associates at the push of a button, 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

Last month, our Lifeline office received notification of an incident involving a 58-year-old woman who subscribed to our AutoAlert service because she lives alone and has several medical conditions. At 1:00 am on a Sunday morning, her Lifeline AutoAlert button signaled a fall. When Lifeline monitors attempted to speak with her there was no answer. EMS workers were dispatched and they found her unresponsive on her floor. There was a strong gas odor in her townhouse and it was evident that she had passed out from poisonous fumes. Fortunately, she recovered on the way to the hospital and is now doing well.

As it turns out, her neighbor had used an automatic transmission

button to turn off her car in the garage adjacent to our subscriber's unit. However, the engine was already turned off, so she unknowingly turned the motor back on. Thus, carbon monoxide gas seeped from the neighbor's garage into our subscriber's home. Her fall was caused by loss of consciousness from these emissions. Talk about someone who is glad she signed up for Lifeline AutoAlert!

The AutoAlert option provides an added layer of protection by automatically placing a call for help when a fall is detected. If a subscriber is disoriented, immobilized, or unconscious and can't push the button, the signal will still go through. This enhanced service gives even greater peace of mind and confidence to subscribers and their loved ones. Lifeline is the **ONLY** medical alert service provider that integrates this capability into a pendant-style Help Button. For more information, please contact Marilyn Kline at 831-8475.

CATCH-A-CAB: Staying Connected to the Community



Independence begins with mobility. Although some people are no longer able to drive as much as they once did, Jewish residents 65 years of age or older are able to stay connected to the community through the JFS Catch-a-Cab program. The program is the brainchild of Adele Cahn who understood the connection between affordable transportation and continued vitality and well-being. Participants in the program can purchase \$100 worth of cab coupons for \$25. Coupons may be ordered every three months. Ron M's Cab Service, Metry Cab, White Fleet Cab, and Yellow Checker Cabs currently participate in the program.

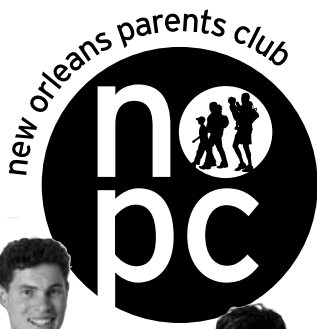

HOMEMAKER

"Looking forward to my support, love, and getting out on a weekly basis has saved me!" reported one of our homemaker clients. This particular client joined the Homemaker Program upon returning home after receiving rehab due to a leg amputation. Returning home was a severe challenge. Our client not only had to learn how to navigate her home in a new way, she was now also completely dependent on others for transportation. She has no local family and only one close friend. Being on a fixed income, yet needing assistance within the home and transportation for groceries at the very least, she was a perfect candidate for our program. The relationship she and her homemaker developed has also helped with the depression that set in once she was home and adjusting to her limitations.

The JFS Homemaker program provides in-home assistance for disabled or older adults. Since 1975, JFS homemakers have been helping people with tasks of daily living and ensuring both safety and



independence of individuals in their home. JFS offers the only home-care assistance program that includes a transportation component in New Orleans.

The homemaker staff is sensitive to each client's needs. Ongoing supervision and training assures the quality of this program. The cost is on a sliding fee scale based on income and ranges from \$8 to \$36 per visit. There are no age restrictions on this service.
