Dear Friend of Jewish Family Service:

This summer brings special concerns, with the height of hurricane season on the horizon and, hopefully, the worst of the BP oil spill in the rear-view mirror. We've seen both sides of the coin this year—a Super Bowl victory and a man-made natural disaster—yet life goes on through both our euphoria and our apprehension.

Since our last newsletter, JFS has been active in assisting JFS of Nashville in establishing programs to assist Tennesseans who had been impacted by the March floods. In fact a telephone call to Deena Gerber, our executive director, was the first call made by JFS Nashville's director, Pam Kelner, to learn our agency's "best practices" in responding to disasters. It is a testament to the hard work of Deena and our JFS family after Katrina and the excellent results that they achieved that another agency would reach out to JFS as its foremost response advisor.


We have also been active here at home, focusing on our counseling, case management, financial assistance, and Lifeline programs. We are also adapting to the needs of our region, expanding our Teen Life Counts teen suicide prevention program to schools in parishes most affected by the oil spill.

An innovative program for parents of young children, the New Orleans Parents' Club, will begin on September 13th at the Uptown JCC. This group will meet weekly through the 2010-2011 school year. Dr. Dahlia Topolosky, a psychologist, will facilitate the sessions, which will focus on positive parenting techniques, building the child's self-esteem and a

healthy family environment. We are very excited about this new program and our ongoing partnership with the JCC.

On October 2, 2010, we will be co-hosting Victory on the Bayou, a community fundraiser with the JCC and Hillel. The event will be held in the new wing of the National World War II Museum in the Warehouse District. Patrons will enjoy a private screening of the 4-D movie "Beyond All Boundaries." All guests will be treated to food from John Besh's The American Sector, and entertainment by the Victory Belles and the Victory 6 swing band. As a new year, 5771, approaches with hope for renewed prosperity for our region, JFS continues to be an active participant in our community, just as it has for the past 60 years. Our annual Rosh Hashanah gift basket program, organized this year by new Board member Lauren Greenberg Wakeman, will distribute apples and honey to community members to ring in the new year. Lauren has done an excellent job organizing this program and has been a wonderful addition to the board. JFS is a leading provider of social services for the entire community at all age levels. JFS provides guidance and psychotherapy for individuals and families under the supervision of our highly trained staff of experienced therapists and counselors. For more information about the listings below, please call (504) 831-8475. Services are available by appointment and are offered on a sliding fee scale.

COUNSELING, SERVICES AND PROGRAMS

- **Counseling** – Guidance and psychotherapy for individuals of all ages, couples and families
- **Case Management** – Planning assistance for long-term care
- **I & R** – “Information about” and “Referral to” a variety of mental health resources and social services available in our community
- **Adoption** – Home studies and post-placement reports
- **Teen Suicide Prevention** – “Teen Life Counts” is the largest Louisiana suicide awareness & prevention program
- **Divorce Mediation Services** - Resources for every member of the family (Northshore only)

GROUPS

- **New Orleans Parents’ Club (NOPC)** – A weekly opportunity to socialize with other parents and learn effective and positive discipline techniques
- **Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT)** - Emotional regulation, distress tolerance, interpersonal effectiveness, and mindfulness are the four key areas
- **Parents of Troubled Adults** – For parents of adult children suffering from mental illness, substance abuse or other difficult situations

FINANCIAL RESOURCE CENTER

The Jewish Family Service Financial Resource Center (JFSFRC) offers interest-free loans to Jewish individuals and families whose needs are urgent and who may not qualify through traditional financial resources.

JFSFRC loan programs change lives, working to promote self-sufficiency with dignity. Loan amounts are from \$1000 - \$5000 per household.

To be eligible to apply for an interest-free loan, applicants must be Jewish, 25 or over, with a history of financial independence. Applicants must be residents of Greater New Orleans for at least 1 year prior to application. Net assets not to exceed \$50,000 exclusive of primary residence and primary vehicles. All loans need co-signers.

Loan repayment begins 90 days after distribution of funds. Repayment period is not to exceed 5 years from date of loan, and payments are to be made by automatic bank withdrawal.

In 2006 JFS established a new program called the Financial Recovery Center. This program was developed to help individuals rebuild homes and businesses devastated by Hurricane Katrina and the subsequent levee breaches, and to offer financial incentives for newcomers who are committed to the rebuilding of our community. This program has evolved into the Financial Resource Center, which consists of interest-free loans, financial assistance grants and case management services.

LOANS AVAILABLE FOR Emergency Financial

Assistance: Assists normally self-supporting individuals with money for rent, moving expenses, security deposit, car repair or used car purchase, and medical and dental emergencies.

Educational Loans: Loans for technical or vocational training, including re-education. Available to individuals pursuing an advanced degree in the field of social services or education.

Business Loans: Available to business owners looking to expand as well as start up businesses.

Adoption/Fertility Treatment Loans: A program to help with the costs associated with the adoption process or medical treatments

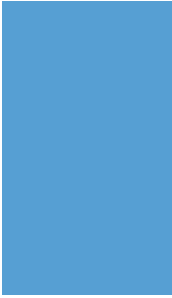

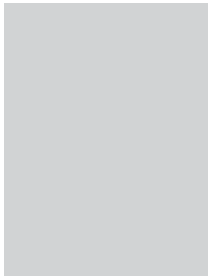

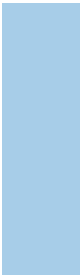

TEEN LIFE COUNTS: Be A Volunteer

Each year, Teen Life Counts (TLC) volunteers teach high school and middle school students about Warning Signs of Suicide. The goal of the program is to help teens identify friends who exhibit or experience these symptoms and help them get to a trusted adult who can get them the professional help they may need.

After completing the Teen Life Counts curriculum at a local high school, Jennifer* approached the TLC volunteer, Lisa* and told her that she had been depressed for a long time.

Jennifer hadn't been getting along with her mom, and her dad was out of the picture. Lisa asked Jennifer if she had ever attempted suicide and she responded that she had several times.

After listening to Lisa talk about the warning signs of suicide and depression, Jennifer realized that she needed help now. She feared that her next attempt might be the last one. Lisa took Jennifer to the school social worker and they called her mom and arranged for therapy to start right away. Jennifer's mom did not know her daughter was severely depressed or suicidal, and credits the Teen Life Counts program with saving her daughter's life.

BIKUR CHAVERIM

Bikur Chaverim, "visiting friends," is a volunteer-based program providing home visits to adults who are homebound or partially homebound. The visits focus on creating relationships in order to have every individual feel alive, to give and receive wisdom,

enjoyment and companionship, and to feel value through each stage of life. The goal of this visit is to have both parties feel purpose and meaning through being together.



Program Coordinator Toby Bonnett, LCSW, leads the program with vigor and heart. "There is so much life and love in everyone; we only have to look for it," she says. "And there is so much we can learn from one another."

CATCH-A-CAB: Staying Connected to the Community



Independence begins with mobility for many older people. Although some no longer carry a driver's license, Jewish residents 65 years of age or older are able to stay connected to the community through the JFS Catch-a-Cab program. The program is the brainchild of Adele

Cahn who understood the connection between affordable transportation and continued vitality and well-being. Participants in the program can purchase \$100 worth of cab coupons for \$25.00. Coupons may be ordered every three months. Metry Cab, White Fleet Cab and Yellow Checker Cabs currently participate in the program.
