### LIFELINE

In mid December, a Slidell woman was attacked and robbed in her home. The robber stole \$62 and slit the woman's throat.

Luckily, this woman was a Lifeline subscriber, and as she was being attacked she had the presence of mind to press her Lifeline 'help needed' button. The Lifeline system responded, repeatedly calling out, "your help call is in progress." The robber got frightened and pulled the phone out of the wall, but the help call had already been sent. The Lifeline response center followed the protocol and called the woman's son. He went over right away, found her in a pool of blood and he immediately called 911. The son said that without Lifeline, she would have died.



### COUNSELING & PSYCHOTHERAPY

Our psychotherapy department consists of 6 full and part time master's level counselors and social workers. We see individuals, couples and families.

Mark, age 14, and his mother sought counseling after Mark's father died from a rapidly debilitating illness. Mark came to JFS because of school refusal, violent outburst at home and school, and frequent thoughts of suicide. Mark said that he felt hopeless and had no future dreams or aspirations. After a brief hospitalization for suicidal ideation, Mark transitioned to a more appropriate school environment where he could receive individualized attention. His mother's counseling has focused on strengthening her parenting skills, while Mark's counseling

## COUNSELING, SERVICES AND PROGRAMS

- Counseling – Guidance and psychotherapy for individuals of all ages, couples and families
- Case Management – Planning assistance for long-term care
- I & R – “Information about” and “Referral to” a variety of mental health resources and social services available in our community
- Adoption – Home studies and post-placement reports
- Teen Suicide Prevention – “Teen Life Counts” is the largest Louisiana suicide awareness & prevention program
- Bikur Chaverim – A volunteer-based program providing home visits to adults who are homebound or partially homebound

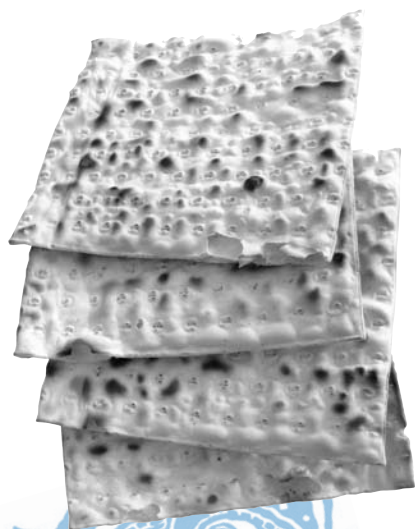

## 25 YEARS OF PASSOVER FOOD BASKETS



This year, Jewish Family Service is busy planning the 25<sup>th</sup> annual Passover Food Baskets Project. Passover baskets are delivered to anyone in the community who needs a little extra help fulfilling the mitzvah of commemorating the Exodus from Egypt. Recipients include—but are not limited to—the elderly, families in need, refugees from the former Soviet Union, and nursing home residents.

The baskets are paid for, assembled, and delivered by volunteers and organizations throughout the New Orleans Jewish community. They are filled with traditional Kosher Seder foods and ritual objects created by local Religious school children.

Volunteers are needed to help pack and deliver the food on Sunday, March 28<sup>th</sup> at the Uptown JCC. We will begin packing at 9am and delivery will begin at 11am. Breakfast will be provided. Families are welcome and encouraged!

has helped him to develop coping skills to manage anger, depression and to process the loss of his father. Through his counseling, Mark has been able to address the primary task of adolescence: discovering his own values, goals, and identity. Thanks in large part to JFS' counseling and intervention, Mark now is working towards his high school diploma, applying for his first job, openly discussing his thoughts and feelings with his mother, and articulating his hopes for his future.

### BIKUR CHAVERIM

Literally translated, "Bikur Chaverim" means "Visiting Friends." This program matches up a person who is lonely, isolated, in an assisted living or nursing home facility, or could use a new friend, with a volunteer who is interested in offering her most precious gift - the gift of time.



A 92 year old woman who has precarious health, lives with and is cared for by her daughter. She worries about what her daughter, who suffers with emphysema, will do when she is gone. The visitor sees her twice a month and has weekly phone contact. They have been a match for over a year and during that time they have gone from awkward acquaintances to dear friends - they have enriched the quality of each other's lives and have come to rely on each other for friendship and support. Part of the success of this program is the monthly meeting of the volunteers - where under the guidance and inspiration of Toby Bonnett (a JFS social worker) volunteers deal with the challenges and opportunities of this unique type of friendship.

## BY THE NUMBERS:

*In the 6 month period between July and Dec of 2009 :*

- **706** individuals received Lifeline service - **183** pressed their button for emergency help
- **67** older adults received **2723** hours of weekly or bi weekly Homemaker service
- **388** people were provided with 1920 hours of psychotherapy
- **212** people received **763** hours of case management services
- **23** financially strapped households received **\$21,214** to help with food, rent and utilities.
- **2709** students in **32** high schools participated in Teen Life Counts. **250** were identified as being at risk for severe depression or suicidal ideation. Every single one of them saw a mental health professional within **24** hours of being identified.
- Over **1000** books were distributed to **3** groups of at-risk students in New Orleans through the Literacy and Latkes Channukah book drive.

# THE JFS HOMEMAKER PROGRAM

Enhancing the Quality of Life of Older Adults and People with Disabilities

Since 1975, The JFS Homemaker program has been at the forefront of assistance for older adults and people with disabilities. JFS homemakers help with everyday tasks, ensuring a safe and independent environment at home. A new client describes her experience with her homemaker:

*"I'm very happy with my homemaker. She tries to help me in every way that she can. I don't even have to ask her to do something, she just does it! She also sits down with me to laugh and talk with me which means so much to me."*

Homemakers understand the varying needs of individual clients. Ongoing training ensures the effectiveness of the program, thus improving the quality of life of clients.

## How The Homemaker Program Works

Homemakers visit clients either weekly or twice a month for 3.5 hours on a regular time schedule. Services include light housekeeping, transportation, laundry, shopping, meal preparation, errands and personal care.

# TEEN LIFE COUNTS: Warning Signs

Each year, Teen Life Counts (TLC) volunteers teach high school and middle school students about Warning Signs of Suicide. The goal of the program is to help teens identify friends who exhibit or experience these symptoms and get them to a trusted adult who can get them the professional help they may need.

*Some of these warning signs include:*

## BEHAVIORAL:

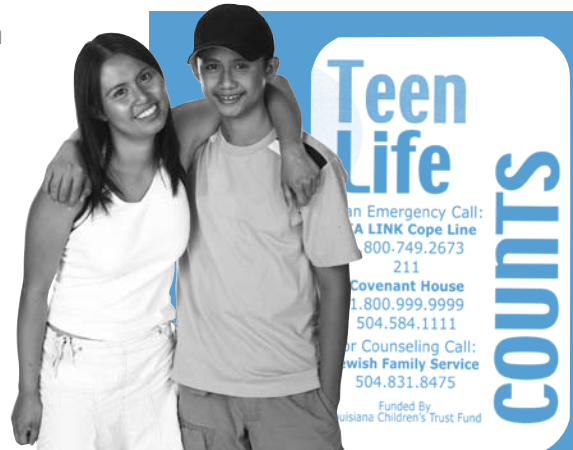
- Crying often or for no reason
- Lack of energy
- Sleeping too much or not enough
- Increase or decrease in appetite
- Loss of interest in and withdrawal from hobbies, sports, job, or school
- Drop in grades. Difficulty completing assignments or paying attention in class
- Giving away possessions
- Tying up loose ends: planning a funeral or writing an obituary or will
- Impulsiveness and risky behavior
- Previous suicide attempt(s)
- Suicide attempts or completions by family or friends
- Increased use of drugs or alcohol
- Neglecting personal cleanliness and appearance
- Frequent mention of death in poetry, writing, or art work
- Change in sexual behavior
- Self-harm, such as cutting, burning or choking oneself
- Suddenly seeming happy after showing many of these signs for a period of time

## VERBAL:

- Direct statements:
  - "I want to die"
  - "I don't want to live anymore"
- Indirect statements:
  - "I hate my life"
  - "I want to go to sleep and never wake up"
  - "They'll be sorry when I'm gone"
  - "Soon the pain will be over"

## THOUGHTS/FEELINGS:

- Feeling sad or hopeless all the time
- Not enjoying things enjoyed
- Feeling confused, having a hard time making decisions
- Can't seem to concentrate
- Feeling angry, irritable, destructive or violent
- Feeling isolated and lonely
- Guilt, self-blame, sense of worthlessness and low self-esteem
- Feeling anxious or having panic attacks
- Distorted thinking – hard to remember ever feeling good
- Lack of interest in plans for the future
- Thinking about suicide
- Feelings of despair

## BECOME A TLC VOLUNTEER TODAY

Twice a year, JFS offers two-day training for school professionals and community volunteers on suicide prevention. Volunteers must be 21 or older and must be available during school hours to teach the curriculum. You can make a difference in a teen's life. Contact Ellie at (504) 831-8475.

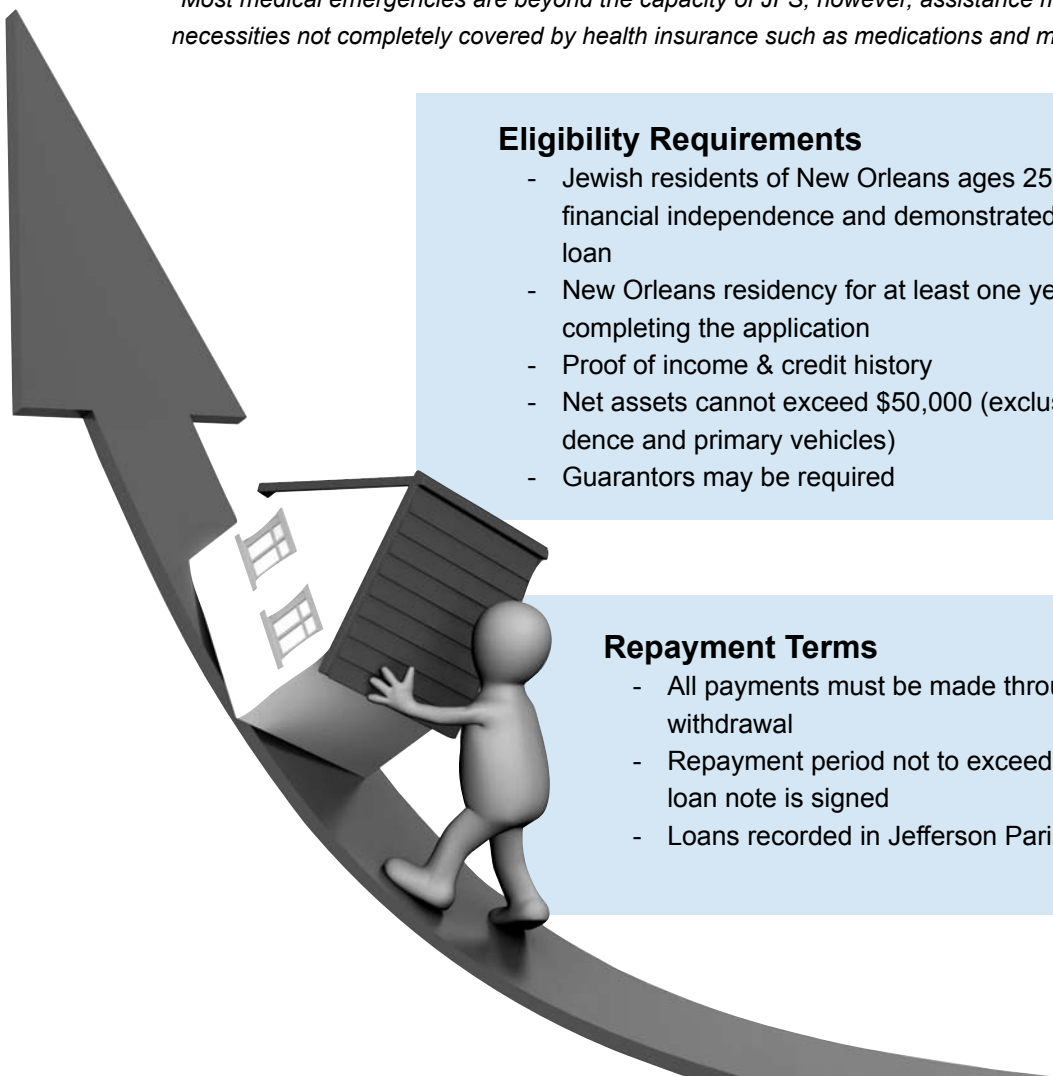
*\*Most medical emergencies are beyond the capacity of JFS, however, assistance may be available for necessities not completely covered by health insurance such as medications and medical equipment.*

## Eligibility Requirements

- Jewish residents of New Orleans ages 25+ with a history of financial independence and demonstrated ability to repay the loan
- New Orleans residency for at least one year from the time of completing the application
- Proof of income & credit history
- Net assets cannot exceed \$50,000 (exclusive of primary residence and primary vehicles)
- Guarantors may be required

## Repayment Terms

- All payments must be made through automatic bank withdrawal
- Repayment period not to exceed 5 years from date loan note is signed
- Loans recorded in Jefferson Parish, La

## CATCH-A-CAB

Staying Connected to the Community

Independence begins with mobility for many older people. Although some no longer carry a driver's license, Jewish residents 65 years of age or older are able to stay connected to the community through the JFS Catch-a-Cab program. The program is the brainchild of Adele Cahn who understood the connection between affordable transportation and continued vitality and well being.

Participants in the program can purchase \$100 worth of cab coupons for \$25.00. Coupons may be ordered every three months. Metry Cab, White Fleet Cab and Checker Yellow Cabs currently participate in the program.

Taxi Cabs may be used for:

- Attending Synagogue
- Visiting friends and family
- Doctor's visits
- Grocery stores, bank and shopping malls
- Emergencies
- Miscellaneous weekly and monthly travel needs

In addition to Adele Cahn's generosity, JFS would like to thank the Cahn Family Foundation and the Jewish Endowment Foundation for making Catch-a-Cab possible.
